Summary	Outlines the Surf Life Saving Central Coast 2009 Youth Leaders Program and nomination process.
Objective	To support the personal development of U13-U14 year members, expand their understanding and awareness of current issues, pathways and opportunities, and create encouraging and fun learning experiences for exchanging of ideas and self challenges.
Action	Distribution. Nominations are due at Branch by Thursday 5th November 2009.

Surf Life Saving Central Coast invites nominations for the 2009 Youth Leadership Development Program. The Youth Leadership Development Program is aimed at Youth members within the U13 and U14 age groups with potential to become a leader and have an interest in improving their surf club.

SLSCC presents a range of leadership and team-building activities along with topic focused presentations. The program also incorporates a workshop session aimed at allowing participants to develop events, functions and activities that they believe will increase Youth participation and satisfaction in surf lifesaving on the Central Coast.

Clubs are encouraged to use this program as a method of recognising members who have the potential to develop skills further by working with like-minded youth. The program will be run over the weekend of 5-6 December 2009 at La Salle Youth Camp, Kincumber.

Clubs will be allocated four (4) positions in the program and should rank all other interested applicants in preferential order. It would be ideal to have two male and two female applicants per club. Positions not filled will be allocated to the most promising applicants from other clubs.

Overview

Leadership is a vital factor in the continued development of Australian communities. Surf Life Saving Central Coast (SLSCC) is committed to the personal development of identified leaders within its membership and the wider community.









The Youth Leadership Development Program is aimed at Youth members within the U13 and U14 age groups with potential to become a leader and have an interest in improving their surf club.

The Program

The Program is structured as a one off weekend in a camp setting and is aimed at members who have qualities that can be developed to enhance their future and that of surf lifesaving.

SLSCC presents a range of leadership and team-building activities along with topic focussed presentations. The program also incorporates a workshop session aimed at allowing participants to develop events, functions and activities that they believe will increase Youth participation and satisfaction in surf lifesaving on the Central Coast.

Aims of the *2009-10 Youth Leadership Development Program* include:

-  To create situations that promote fun learning experiences
-  To create an awareness of current issues, pathways and opportunities
-  To promote teamwork, communication skills and networking
-  To form friendships with other like-minded youth within the Central Coast Branch
-  To develop confidence, self esteem and empowerment in a supportive environment whilst positively recognising members
-  Provide opportunities for ideas to be exchanged
-  To gain knowledge of the structure of surf lifesaving
-  Have fun

Commitment

It is expected that each participant will be fully committed and available for the *2009-10 Youth Leadership Development Program* over the whole weekend.

Who Can Apply?

The Youth Leadership Development Program targets U13-U14 age group members who have qualities that can be developed to enhance their future and that of surf lifesaving. It is also geared toward creating greater awareness of opportunities for these members. Potential participants can come from a range of different backgrounds, interests and areas of focus within the club environment.

Applicants should be:

- In the U13 or U14 age group;
- a member of a Central Coast Branch Club;
- available for the camp;
- committed to full participation in the program;

Selection Process

Positions are open to a maximum of 60 participants. Clubs will be allocated four (4) positions in the Program and should rank all other interested applicants in preferential order. It would be ideal for each club to have two U13 members; one male and one female, as well as two U14 members; one male and one female. Positions not filled will be allocated to the most promising applicants from other clubs. Clubs are recommended to send members that have not attended this Program previously. Successful applicants will be informed of their selection Tuesday 17th November 2009.
