# Timekeeper and Pool Setting

As per usual, to insure the day runs smoothly, clubs will be required to supply volunteer "timekeepers" and "pool setters" for the day. These positions require no training or qualifications. All instructions will be provided on the day.

**Timekeepers**: SLSCC recommend clubs set up a roster for their timekeeping allocation. The first timekeepers will be required to report to the starting end of the pool at 8:45am.

**Pool Setters:** These members will get in and out of the water during the competition, helping set up the required equipment for each event. We recommend pool setters bring at least 2 towels and wear a wetsuit.

#### Results

Results will be posted on a wall within the pool – likely the glass outside (weather permitting).

#### Pointscore and Medals

- 1. "All Ages" events will be separated into age groups for pointscore and medals purposes as per the SLSA Surf Sports Manual. Categories are U11, U12, U13, U14, U15, U17, U19 and Opens.
- 2. "Masters" events will be separated into age groups of 10 year increments for pointscore and medals purposes. Categories are 30 39, 40 49, 50 59, 60 and over.
- 3. "Masters" teams will contest "Open" categories within team events. There are no "Masters" team events.
- 4. Relay events will be contested in "Combined Age Groups" meaning that results **will not** be separated into individual results for pointscore and medal purposes. E.g. Event 9 Mixed 4 x 50m Obstacle Relay U11 to U13 will be resulted together as one event.
- 5. Competitors may only contest one age group per individual or relay "event".
- 6. The following pointscore will apply:  $1^{st} = 6$  points,  $2^{nd} = 5$  points,  $3^{rd} = 4$  points,  $4^{th} = 3$  points,  $5^{th} = 2$  points,  $6^{th} = 1$  point.









- 7. Where a dead heat (as defined in the current SSM) occurs in the final of an event the Clubs of the individuals/teams will share the placing points relative to the finish placing. The club of the next individuals/teams to finish will receive the relative placing points based on the number of individuals/teams finishing ahead of them. For example: if two individuals/teams finish equal 3rd, both individuals/teams shall receive 4 points for their club and the next individual/team shall be awarded 2 points for coming 5th.
- 8. If in the event of equal points in the overall point score a count back of placings (i.e. most number of first placings, then second placings etc.) shall be undertaken to determine the winner. If, after an exhaustive review, teams cannot be separated, a tied point score shall be declared.
- 9. If a non-SLSCC team or individual medals (1st, 2nd or 3rd place), they will be awarded a medal equal to the placing gained. However, the next SLSCC club team or individual to place shall be awarded the SLSCC Championship title and/or equivalent medal. Visitors will not be eligible for pointscore.

Medals can be collected from the recording table once the results have been published in the Results Link on the day.

# Equipment

## Swim Fins Specifications for U13 and Under Age Category Events

The swim fins used in events for U13 and under aged events are restricted to soft/flexible rubber type fins used for swimming training as depicted below:



Please note that fins that do not meet this general profile or are specific purpose diving or surfing/bodyboarding fins and/or with stiff and/or elongated blades, will not be permitted for use in U13 and under aged events.

The swim fins shall comply with the following dimensions:

- Maximum 50cm overall length including the shoe.
- Maximum 25cm width at the widest point of the blade.

Swim fins are to be measured with the shoe or ankle strap extended but not stretched. Swim fins will not be permitted to be used if they do not conform to the specifications or if they are considered to be safety hazard.

Note: Fins are measured while not being worn

Please note that fins that do not meet this general profile or are dedicated dive fins and those with stiff and/or elongated blades will not be permitted for use U13 and under aged events.

#### Behavior and Misconduct

- Misconduct before, during and after the Championships will not be tolerated. Offending members risk disciplinary action against themselves and their Clubs.
