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Instructor

A **Casual Community Education Instructor** is responsible for assisting SLSCC with the delivery of beach and water safety education programs to a variety of groups with a focus on primary schools.

Key responsibilities include;

- Assisting with the delivery of on-beach programs such as Surf Awareness Programs and Surf Fun Days to school aged children.
- Ensuring that all participants are taught appropriate surf safety and awareness and are provided with a safe and enjoyable experience.
- Representing the SLSCC brand with pride and integrity in a public setting.

Essential Criteria

- 1. Knowledge and ability to work with children.
- 2. Ability to work well unsupervised as well as in a team environment.
- 3. Excellent verbal communication and interpersonal skills with the ability to engage a wide variety of audiences.

4. Moderate level of fitness to enable standing for longer periods of time and assisting with on beach activities.

- 5. Demonstrated ability to carry out safety procedures and use appropriate safety equipment.
- 6. Current membership at a Surf Club under SLSA.
- 7. A current Bronze Medallion/Cert II in Public Safety.
- 8. A current or willingness to obtain a current 'paid' working with children check (WWCC).

Supervisor

A **Casual Community Education Supervisor** is responsible for leading a team with the delivery of beach and water safety education programs to a variety of groups with a key focus on primary schools.

Key responsibilities include;

- Leading a team of instructors on the beach to deliver our program to local school groups.
- Ensure the smooth and efficient operation of each daily program.
- Liaise with school teachers, lifeguards and other parties on the day of each program.
- Use a SLSCC vehicle to transport our "Community Education" trailer to and from the beach each day.
- Lead and assist with the delivery of on-beach programs such as Surf Awareness Programs and Surf Fun Days to school aged children.
- Ensuring that all participants are taught appropriate surf safety and awareness and are provided with a safe and enjoyable experience.
- Representing the SLSCC brand with pride and integrity in a public setting.

Essential Criteria

- 1. Strong leadership skills and the ability to manage a group of staff.
- 2. Knowledge and ability to work with children.
- 3. Ability to work well unsupervised as well as in a team environment.
- 4. Excellent verbal communication and interpersonal skills with the ability to engage a wide variety of audiences including teachers, lifeguards and other staff.
- 5. Moderate level of fitness to enable standing for longer periods of time and assisting with on beach activities.

- 7. Current membership with a Surf Club under SLSA.
- 8. A current Bronze Medallion/Cert II in Public Safety.
